



We are delighted to have 7 new Parent Champions this quarter. They were active in designing the Parent Engagement survey which has given them really useful data about the priorities for parents in the area.





C&YW sub-group have been talking with Colm Walsh from Queens University about the impact of violence in communities. They agreed to work together on creating safe spaces for young people to explore this and plan to train in the YBox model as a group and develop a map of spaces where young people can access support.

SCHOOLS GROUP



Lego Therapy

In March, 27 teachers and classroom assistants teachers from primary schools and Abbey Community College received training in Lego Therapy.

Assessment Workshops

In January, school Principals met together to focus on using literacy and numeracy data to show how children and young people's learning is improving. They learnt from West Belfast schools who cooperate together like they do in THRIVE.



PATHWAYS

We held two workshops looking at **Pathways** to employment and training for young people in the area. School staff, further education college, LMP, skills training organisations, youth and community workers agreed making connections between young people and employment and training is a big priority for us collectively. Young people also shared their lived experiences and would be keen to stay involved in the Pathways work.

Voice & Influence



Several local groups continue to develop projects to create space for young people to influence their groups and the wider community. Some groups have been talking about promoting positive mental wellbeing and resilience, while

others have been building capacity to speak up about the issues they find important. Groups came together for a Learning Event to find out more about Children's Rights and listen to young people from Connected Minds in Lisburn who are leading a project on young people's mental health.

This project has helped me learn more about myself, my culture & about decision making at a local & regional level.
